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### Action Taken Report of 28<sup>th</sup> IQAC Meeting Held on 28<sup>th</sup> June-2025

Agenda Item No.	Resolution	Action Taken
1	The minutes of the 27 <sup>th</sup> IQAC meeting held on 18 <sup>th</sup> March 2025 were reviewed and unanimously approved without any modifications.	Minutes of the previous meeting were recorded and uploaded to the official IQAC records.
2	The ATR was presented and accepted. Departments were advised to expedite the completion of pending actions to ensure timely compliance.	All pending actions from previous ATR were accepted, and departments submitted compliance reports within the stipulated timelines.
3	The progress on AQAR reports for academic year 2023-24 and 2024-25 was reviewed. All departments were directed to complete data submission by 15 <sup>th</sup> July 2025.	Departments submitted the required AQAR data before the deadline. AQAR reports for 2023-24 were almost finalized, and preparation for 2024-25 submissions is ongoing.
4	The current status of the autonomy application was reviewed. Advised to follow-up and expedite the same. Formation of statutory bodies recommended to manage the academic, administrative, and governance transition.	Follow-ups were made with UGC regarding the autonomy application. Statutory bodies for academic and administrative governance have been constituted.
5	Progress in pedagogy reforms was appreciated. Advised to align curriculum with NEP 2020, focus on faculty capacity-building, and monitor implementation.	The curriculum for 2025-26 is proposed for revision to align with NEP 2020 guidelines, pending approval of autonomous status. Faculty members have been actively encouraged to engage in both in-house and external FDPs, conferences, and workshops, supported fully by the institute. The continuous monitoring mechanism has been thoroughly evaluated through the Academic Monitoring Audit to ensure its effective implementation.
6	Reports on international conferences were reviewed. IQAC congratulated departments for successful events fostering academic excellence and global engagement.	All four departments successfully organized international conferences. Reports were documented, and best practices shared for future events.
7	The academic and activity calendar was thoroughly reviewed and approved. Faculty requirements were assessed, with particular emphasis on integrating NEP-aligned practices and strengthening experiential learning initiatives.	The academic calendar has been successfully implemented, and faculty recruitment has been initiated to fill vacant positions. NEP-aligned teaching practices have been integrated into the semester plan to enhance the learning experience.



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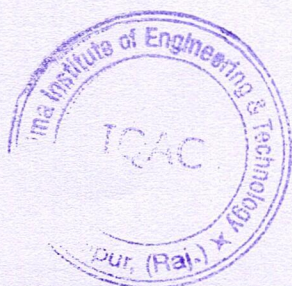
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8	The status of feedback collection from students, faculty, and stakeholders for the Even Semester 2024-25 was analyzed. IQAC provided detailed insights to departments to guide corrective actions and improvements.	Feedback reports were comprehensively analyzed, offering departments actionable insights. Based on the findings, corrective measures were implemented to strengthen teaching practices, curriculum delivery, and administrative processes.
9	IQAC Advised to adopt new AAA format as per Autonomous Status commencing 2024-25 to ensure institutional preparedness.	AAA format revised and implemented. Audit schedules executed as per autonomous requirements. Reports compiled for institutional review.
10	IQAC reviewed faculty participation in FDPs, conferences, and professional development initiatives, and encouraged active engagement at both national and international levels.	All faculty members actively participated in 307 activities, including FDPs, workshops, and conferences. Furthermore, all departments and cells organized a total of 276 events, of which 38 comprised high-quality international conferences, workshops, and FDPs, aimed at further advancing professional development and enhancing faculty skills.
11	NSS and departmental outreach initiatives acknowledged. Emphasis on structured and sustainable community engagement.	Extension and outreach programs conducted successfully. NSS activities expanded, and structured initiatives for community engagement implemented.
12	Ongoing sustainability initiatives appreciated. Recommended strengthening with more green practices like plastic-free campus and solar panel capacity.	Green campus initiatives have been further strengthened, with the adoption of plastic-free campus practices, increased solar energy capacity, and the implementation of awareness campaigns. The institute also conducted a comprehensive green audit to assess and enhance sustainability efforts.
13	Status report on IPR filings and research publications reviewed. Encouraged departments to maintain momentum and focus on quality journals and patent opportunities.	Faculty members across all departments have published 48 research papers in reputed Scopus/WoS-indexed journals, 191 research papers in Scopus-indexed conference proceedings, 43 book chapters in Scopus-indexed books, and 12 patents. IPR filings have been meticulously tracked, and patent applications submitted. A robust continuous monitoring system has been implemented to ensure sustained growth and excellence in research output.
14	No additional agenda items were raised. Chair acknowledged contributions and concluded the meeting with appreciation.	Meeting concluded successfully. Members' contributions documented, and action points implemented.
